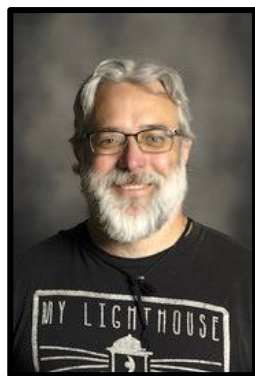

## Prayerful Ponderings from Pastor Paul

### “Seeking Wisdom”

During the month of September, we will be encountering the Old Testament Books that are often grouped

together as Wisdom Literature, and we will have an opportunity in our worship to explore the various types of wisdom that we can glean from the library that is our Bible. It seems appropriate to begin that series just 2 weeks after we journeyed with Solomon as he asked God for wisdom.

Solomon asked for wisdom for a specific purpose in 1 Kings chapter 3. He was concerned about fulfilling his role as King of Israel, a role to which he was chosen and appointed by his father and the prophets and priests of God in a rushed inauguration when he was only 20 years old.

It is interesting to ponder this rise to leadership and resulting level of responsibility in our current season. We read of the concern for the ability to discern what is right and wrong. Solomon began his time as King humbling himself before God claiming to not know his duties nor feel like he or anybody would be equipped to govern God’s people, even though he had witnessed David’s reign and knew better than most what it would take to be a king. How often do we witness false bravado or rushing ahead without thinking when people are given a position of power? How often do those who seek positions of leadership claim to have the answers and know what is best for those they would lead?

May we pray for ourselves, our leaders of all levels, and all those who would lead the nations of this world, that we would humbly seek God’s wisdom and long for great judgements to come from the discernment of God’s gifts, God’s provision, and God’s will. The world that God so loves deserves justice, deserves long life, deserves to prosper, and deserves the opportunity to live lives that

honor the God who calls each and every one of us.

## A Change in Times, A Change in Perspective

“It is with great joy that I invite you into a new opportunity in our ministry as Spearfish United Methodist Church. The people of our Worship and Music Team are dedicated to providing excellent worship opportunities within our community and they are a blessing to our congregation and to me personally. I am thankful for their care in seeking out the dreams, concerns, and opinions around worship times. This plan will bless our church and equip us well for making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. My hope is that this community that embraced me and encouraged me in this transition into serving you will continue the energy of anticipation for what can be. None of us are naive about the ways this will make some of us uncomfortable, yet we know that greatness and joy can come in the uncomfortable times of life. May God’s Spirit of creativity bring forth rich possibilities and unforeseen victories in and through us.” *Pastor Paul*

After much discussion, guided by the thoughts and opinions shared by you, our church community, the Worship and Music Committee has decided our Sunday morning worship times will be Gathering service at 9 am, a time of combined fellowship at 10 am, and the Sanctuary service at 11 am. This change will occur starting September 8, 2024, and last at least till the end of 2024, when we will reassess the effectiveness of the



change. There will be no change to the Saturday night Blue Jeans service.

There is one thing that we hope this change will foster, GROWTH. GROWTH in our youth and young families. We hope that it will be more supportive of young families and give them more choice in the style of worship service they attend. We wanted to make it easier, not harder, for them to get their families ready for any of our worship services.

We hope it will GROW our fellowship across worship services. We would like to become one supportive community and not just Blue Jeans people and Gathering people and Sanctuary people. A combined fellowship is one small step toward that dream. We are also not going to stop an unofficial fellowship time from happening following Sanctuary service organically. It just would no longer have a sign up for a treat's provider.

We want it to GROW our spirituality by allowing Sunday schools, from children to adults, to utilize that Combined Fellowship time and let their members experience either worship time. And last but not least, we hope it will GROW the quality of both our Sunday worship services.

The main reason we started this discussion is that those of us who run the services were feeling less and less capable of being completely prepared for both services. Pastor Paul did not have time to truly be in fellowship with the Gathering Congregation. There was no flexibility to run even slightly long on the early service. Church musicians were juggling who was going to practice where and, honestly, dropping some balls along the way.

We hope that you will continue to join us on Spearfish UMC's faith journey through this time of adaptation. If you have any constructive criticisms, please let Kevin Nakajima or Pastor Paul know.

In summary, starting Sunday, September 8, Gathering service will be at 9 am, combined fellowship and Sunday School at 10 am, and Sanctuary service will be at 11 am. Thank you for your continued support and ability to adapt to change.
