

Prayerful Ponderings from Pastor Paul

The importance of "No," "No, thank you," and "Not at this time."

It is great to be surrounded by people who care about us. So many people from our congregation have reminded me to take time for myself, my family, and my relationship with God. The District Superintendent has also "gently challenged" me to protect my day off and my



sabbath time. All of this being true, the best advice I have received has come from someone who shares this advice freely with some of you as well. Orvette stops me from the "automatic yes," with a reminder that "No,"

"No thank you," and "Not at this time," are also appropriate answers when I am invited to do something.

God, told David, "Not at this time," when he wanted to build a temple. Jesus said a pretty emphatic, "No," to Peter who tried to derail him from the Gospel reality of his coming suffering, death, and resurrection. The Biblical narrative is filled with God or faithful people declining what is offered or expected and we as disciples can learn a great deal from those moments. Most of the time, the "no," opens doors to other things that we can say, "Yes" to. Recently, I have encountered this in worship preparation as, I have to say, "Not, this year," to some of my favorite passages and books of the Bible as they come up in the offered readings for each week. I have found joy in the scriptures and themes that we have been able to encounter and learn from because I did not fall back on my favorites, but it is still a difficult, "No," for me.

What will we as individuals, families, and as a church say, "not at this time," to in order to say, "Yes!" to where God is calling us today? Each of us have limited time, energy, attention, and resources and we want to use

them well in the unique roles and situations that God has called us. We want to work with others for the greatest shared future in ways that utilize each of our gifts well.

God is moving in powerful and beautiful ways in and through Spearfish United Methodist Church. May God grant us the discerning wisdom to know when to decline an invitation because I am excited to see where and when we can say, "Yes!"

I can't wait to see what God and SUMC do next in our church, our community, and our world.

Health Forum on QPR Training Question, Persuade, Refer for Suicide Prevention

Suicidal thoughts are common. Suicide threats and attempts are less common, but more frequent than you may realize. South Dakota had the 5th highest suicide death rate in 2021 (per CDC WISQRS.) Just as people trained in CPR and Heimlich Maneuver help save thousands of lives each year, QPR is an innovative, practical and proven method for suicide prevention that anyone can learn to save the life of a family member, friend, colleague, or neighbor. Participants will be able to recognize the warning signs and clues of people in trouble, and gain skills to act quickly to prevent a possible tragedy through learning how to Question, Persuade, and Refer someone to help. QPR offers hope through positive action, and hope saves lives.

This training is hosted by the Congregational Care Ministry Team and will be presented by the Lawrence County Coalition, on **Sunday, October 6 at 2:00 pm.** The Lawrence County Coalition, is a grant funded, volunteer-driven 501(c)3 non-profit organization whose mission is, "mobilizing the community to promote healthy, positive and substance-free lifestyles."

Shirt Update


We have sold a total of 96 shirts. This has been a successful project, and we would like to thank you all for purchasing the shirts!

School is back in session, and CYFM is excited to welcome the new school year and all the events it brings as we slowly get into the season of fall! We thank all the families that have brought their kids in for the **new**Sunday School time of 10AM-10:55AM that started on

September 8th, and we thank everyone who participated in celebrating the new Sunday School year with our Sunday Sundaes event that occurred during the same time and day as our



first Sunday School session to bring out everyone's inner kid to share joyous times of ice cream, cookies, pretzels and a small photo gallery display of previous events!

To go along with the changes in times of service and Sunday School, we recognize that means other wavs of coming together may involve some adjustments as well! If your child is in Children's Sunday School, we have opened a new line of communication through and app educators often use called **Class Dojo** – as a way to allow families an easy form of communication with our Sunday School staff, and as a way to inform parents of what we are doing in Sunday School, along with what family-related events and information are upcoming. Throughout this year, we are slowly working to incorporate more informed safe practices into our family-related events. One of such things that we will begin informing Sunday School parents about is a Sunday School sign in/out sheet we will use to compliment our current attendance record-keeping. This will be a quick sheet that parents sign off on each Sunday, so that we have record of who the children were released to each week. We will continue to inform families of upcoming changes throughout the year to ensure the best of safety and assurance for our families and their children!

More changes our families may wish to know more about is our **overall schedule for where children have the opportunity to explore and when on Sundays!** We are here to support children and their families on Sundays through:

- Our upstairs Nursery, open to children up to age 6 during the 9AM, 10AM, and 11AM worship and fellowship times
- Our upstairs Children's Sunday School, two doors down from the Nursery, open to children from age 3 up to 5th grade from 10AM-10:55AM

- Youth Sunday School for 6th grade and up in the Youth Group room downstairs from 10AM-11AM
- **During the 9AM service**, we have a children's area available up at the front right pews with Brenda Lint to be with peers and fidget toys and tools
- Plus, during each of the church services, we have books and fidgets in the back by the Fellowship Hall for families to enjoy as they wish to bring into the pews with them, or at the children's table in the Fellowship Hall as well!

Next to mention, we have a fall-favorite upcoming event we're planning for – our always well-anticipated **Trunk or Treat!** All are welcome inside or outside of our church community for a fun community time of dressing up for



carnival games, face painting, snacks, and trick or treating in the parking lot to check out some well-decorated car trunks! Children First



As of the end of August Children First has completed another wonderful and successful year with our CF kids and families. Our new school year began September 3rd with 82 children in attendance

served by 25 dedicated staff members. It is such fun to see our babies move from the Baby Room to the Waddler Room (1-year-olds), our waddlers move to the Toddler Room (2-year-olds), our toddlers move to Miss Becky's 3-Year-Old Preschool class, and Miss Becky's former kids move to Miss Sarah's 4- and 5-Year-Old Preschool class! Children First also provides daycare for our preschoolers before and after classes.

Children First is a state-certified facility owned and operated by Spearfish United Methodist Church. We are so grateful for support, both moral and financial, from the people of the church. Thank you for your pledges, special gifts, and contributions to the Mission of the Month for September which this year are being used for classroom supplies for CF.

Childcare in Spearfish, in South Dakota, in the United States is in crisis as tuition costs rise and wages for childcare workers remain low making hiring difficult. Children First families pay nearly \$9,500 per child per year for all-day care. It is a priority of Children First that no child be turned away due to the socio-economic status of their family. That makes support for our Scholarship Fund and our new Emergency Fund really important.

Children First regularly helps families in need to pay monthly tuition through our Scholarship Fund. One way to support the Children First Scholarship Fund is to support the UMC-CF Rummage Sale on October 11th and 12th. Our new Emergency Fund is for helping families

who are temporarily experiencing financial hardship and need help with tuition on a short-term basis. A grant from a local charity and proceeds from our Summer Solstice Gala provided money for the Emergency Fund. We plan to make the Gala an annual event.

The building which houses Children First has a new name! We are happy to operate in the Bev and Joe Carr Education Center. Children First is very careful to monitor who should and who should not be in the building or on the grounds of the building. The old name of United Methodist Community Outreach Center was attracting people who were looking for help from the church. It was compromising the safety of our kids to have people near or sometimes even in the building who did not belong there. We are grateful to the UMC Council for making the name change.
