

Prayerful Ponderings from Pastor Paul

The Deep Pain of Division.

Well, as you read this, you are likely within days of election day. You may have already voted for or

against various initiated measures or amendments to our state constitution. You may be preparing to fill in ovals next to a favorite candidate for local, state, or national office. This could be a time for you and I to celebrate, but it is likely that many who read this will be frustrated, disappointed, or even angry when the votes are all counted.

Why is that the reality of our lives? Why do the results of an election in the United States of America cause such pain when we still claim to be a great nation, a free nation, and a beacon of democracy for the world? The simple answer is that no election should ever cause that kind of pain for us. If the people vote and make their wishes known, we should be able to rejoice together in the system and the results.

John Wesley, one of the founders of the Methodist movement, wrote in his journal:

"October 6, 1774—I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them:

- 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy
- 2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against, and
- 3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side."

—John Wesley, Journal of John Wesley

He also shared in one of his sermons:

"Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may. Herein all the children of God may unite, notwithstanding these smaller differences."

—John Wesley

This is our heritage and the hope that we still can live in. The truth behind these ideas is also the reason why our current experience of the world around us can be so painful. I hear questions of, "How can I trust someone who voted for ..." and feel the struggle of what if the vote doesn't go the way that I think is so clearly the better answer?

May we strive for ways to connect with those who have differing views and perspectives. May we stand strong on the foundation in Christ as we defend those at risk of being silenced. May we reject the ideas that those on the other side of an issue or election are demons or enemies. I feel a little bit hypocritical as I remind myself and all of us "to take care [that our] spirits [are] not sharpened against those that voted on the other side." May we witness together to the Christ and the Kingdom of God that rules our hearts and lives and forms us into the people we are much more than any political figure, party, or ideology does. May the one who said of those who hung him on a cross to die, "Forgive them for they know not what they are doing," speak to our hearts and through us to a world and nation invested in division and distrust. God's perfect love can overcome!




All Saints Day November 2 & 3

Christmas is a time of welcoming people into our lives or back into our lives. The way we decorate our homes is a central part of how we celebrate and remember in this season.


The worship team is excited to offer a series this advent using the book, *Christmas in the Four Gospel Homes* by Cynthia Campbell. Our

Children First has had a wonderful start to our school year! For the first couple of months, we have been working on helping the children transition to their new


classrooms, get to know their teachers and any new friends in their class.

Recently, Hurricane Helene brought devastating and debilitating storms across the Southeast area of the United States. At the writing of this letter, Hurricane Milton has made landfall in Florida and the impact will likely be overwhelming.

I can hardly fathom what it must be like to face another storm, even as active recovery efforts are underway and survivors and their support network continue to assess the impact of the historic rainfall, flooding, power outages, and 140 mph winds that have come with these storms.

According to The Associated Press, the category 4 storm that made landfall on September 26th along with its aftermath have killed at least 179 people over six states. As you may know, the mountains of western North Carolina have been particularly hard-hit. We have yet to know what the comprehensive impact will be.

I trust many of you are looking for tangible ways to aid in recovery and support efforts. Therefore, I appeal to every church across the conference to live into what it means to be part of the United Methodist Connection. We can make a difference in the impacted area through our annual Dakotas Conference Thanksgiving Offering. Help to bring hope and recovery to our sisters and brothers whose lives have been disrupted and for whom their homes and livelihoods no longer stand. Our 2024 Thanksgiving Offering: United States Hurricane Response will be to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Domestic Disaster Relief Fund.


