

Pondering with Pastor Paul


Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. (1 Corinthians 12:27)

A Heartfelt "Thank You"



Thank you for your overwhelming generosity supporting the church. Our year end fundraiser was an amazing display of God's grace and your support. Nearly \$12,000 was donated to support the Dakota's Conference.

Supplemented with a portion of the Luena Lent Bequest, we fully met our apportionments for 2024. Apportionments fund the operation of the Dakota's conference and missions such as the Tree of Life (helping the Rosebud reservation), Spirit Lake Ministry, Solar Oven Partners, rural ministry, maintaining church camps, disaster relief and other programs.

Also, nearly \$13,500 was donated for boiler and plumbing repairs. Absolutely amazing and much needed to keep our heating system running properly.

Finally, with the stewardship of the church committees and the congregation's generous support, the general fund ended 2024 with a balanced budget. The general fund pays for the operation of the church (staff salaries, church and parsonage utilities, worship, and Sunday school). It is the resource to impact our community with worship, pastoral care, and outreach.

Here at CYFM, we are excited about the new year and all the activities and plans that we have to provide programs and events for children and their families! We are excited to say that our January "Nourish to Flourish" event was a lot of fun, and we really appreciate all that supported us through either volunteering or attending the event, as we had an even bigger turnout than our last Nourish to Flourish event! Our theme for January's event was Peace, and while adults were led through a group discussion involving peace, kids went upstairs to learn through a story, crafts, songs and games how peace is something that may look different for different people, but it is something everyone can have an strive towards for themselves and others in ways that can be used in everyday life. We look forward to having your support in spreading the word or attending our upcoming Nourish to Flourish events on **the first Sunday of each month from 5-6:30PM** for our themed activities and discussions!

For February, we have some upcoming events to keep the new year focused on the importance of family and connections through:

- Nourish to Flourish event on February 2nd form 5PM-6:30PM- to which people of all ages are welcome join in for a night of a free provided meal, time for children to play with sensory toys and explore our creation station booth, followed by adult discussion and gathering while children go upstairs to do love-themed games, crafts, stories and music.



Children First





This month it will be **Sunday, February 16 at 5pm** and will feature Tonkatsu Pork. Please join us or contact Kevin Nakajima for more information.





We would like you to know that we provide a lot more than Safeway cards. We always try to have warm coats, hats and gloves. We also give out blankets, sleeping bags, and have snacks available. With this cold winter weather, we're running low.

We also have hygiene kits, including travel size

soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and lotion. It has recently come to our attention that some people have no way to shower, so we provide tokens so they can shower at the Spearfish Recreation Center.

Many of our people do not have transportation, so we provide bus tokens so they can go to the Food Pantry, Salvation Army or Job Service. Most are constantly looking for employment.

During February you will have the opportunity to help us fill the baskets of items our neighbors may need. Consider your contribution a *hand up*.

We have added another easy way to E-Give to the church. <u>VENMO</u> is convenient, you just need to Scan the QR code to the right with your smartphone. Make your gift.


